

Some people believe the name Helsinge may have originated with the medieval Swedish settlers who came from HA¤lsingland, in Sweden. Others think the name came from the Swedish word 'hals' which means neck in Swedish, and that it refers to the narrowest part of the river, the rapids. Whatever the derivation of the name, Helsinki is a great place to visit today. It is colorful, independent and strong and there is so much to do and see. In the introduction paragraph there is some insight on how Helsinki got its name and concludes with "...there is much to do and see." Except, well...they forgot to take pictures of anything...unless there is nothing to see. The story is about an open air market, references eating reindeer, stops at a mermaid statue and a dolphin statue, shows a gelatto stand, an old house and two unnamed churches.
