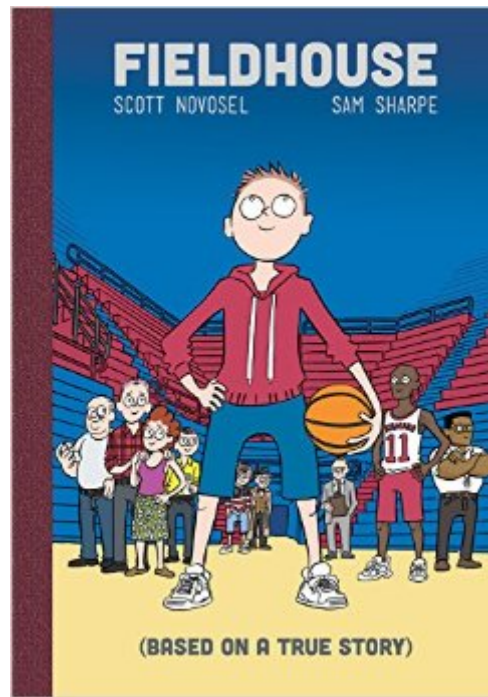

That self-proclaimed mantra is the absolute definition of the author Scott Novosel and the true life story described in this book's definitive motivational pages. From the time Scott was a child he dreamed of playing college basketball for the Kansas Jayhawks even handwriting a youthful letter of introduction to coach Roy Williams. As beautiful as the lifetime quest that is passed on to the reader through words formed in the very heartbeat of Scott's soul the emotional exuberance of graphic-comic-like-art created by Sam Sharpe creates a story-medium that has words and art beating like two hearts in one. Potential readers will become so ensconced in the story and the vibrant colors that at times you forget whether you're reading a book or watching a Technicolor cartoon. The beauty of the story and I'm absorbing the story on numerous fronts. I'm viewing it as a Grandfather who once had similar childhood dreams except with St. Johns University and then the Dodgers and Lakers I'm reminiscing as a Father how I always tried to fertilize my son's boyhood dreams and I'm also fervently grasping not only the content but the youthful æcurbside appeal as a tool to help not only to motivate but to prepare my young Granddaughters for the failures that everyone faces along the road to the mountain top of success. And Scott's numerous increasingly sad obstacles to his dreams are just as important as his eventual success. But he learned along the way that the complete effort he invested in his quest made him a success even if the ultimate dream fluttered away just out of his grasp for eternity. The road of Scott's life with loving Parents siblings and a proud Grandpa who likes to reminisce about his own long gone sports glory days (note: I've been told by a very reliable source that I am quite similar and I agree) all add to the æplausibility æ of using this book as a loving æsmooth as silk æ teaching tool without coming off as a æpushy æ adult. From the very beginning at night while one person in Scott's childhood home is trying to invent something in the garage another is wailing away on a guitar and another is searching for a Zen-like utopia Scott sneaks out of his bedroom window and breaks into the Kansas Jayhawk gym and eventually gets nabbed by the cops. When I was a child I snuck out of my bedroom window because I had the flu and my Mother wouldn't let me play and I ran almost two miles played in the game and we won the championship.

If Scott's story was modernized someone would have been playing video games or fooling around with a smartphone. Those are called choices and that in my humble son-Father-Grandfather-roles is where the teaching with this book can begin. Another old saying of mine "Everybody wants what you have" but they don't want to do what you did to get it! Scott dreamed he sacrificed he overcame many obstacles both mental and physical and he attained his childhood dream of playing for the Jayhawks! What a wonderful story.
