

I bought this to use as a supplement for my 10th grade daughter. I just needed her to think and

maybe use some skills that she wasn't really having to use with typical curriculum. While I think it is a great book and some of the activities are very thought provoking, I do not feel like you could use this as a stand alone curriculum for a student. The website and the representative I spoke with both implied that it could be used alone and I think that is very misleading. If you just need some added activities to stimulate thinking skills, this is a great companion BUT if you are looking for a stand alone curriculum, this is not it.
