

I've browsed this book multiple times in stores, and finally decided to purchase it. I think the book is excellent all around, and has some very creative ideas, especially for blankets and onesies. However, I must disagree with the previous reviewer - I was a bit disappointed with the crochet patterns and felt that the knit ones were much more inspired. But that is probably just a difference in taste! A breakdown of the patterns -24 blankets (2 with alternate color variations)3 toys (a bird, a caterpillar, and an orange slice)1 bib4 dresses6 cardigans1 pullover1 bunting3 onesies/rompers3 hats (2 with alternate color variations)

I love Norah's patterns but this collection is a HUGE disappointment. Why? The sizes for almost every clothing pattern stop at 24 months which means it is not a collection of baby AND toddler patterns. I thought I had found a 'gap' book to fill that void between baby and child sizes, but this book is not that and is a let down.

The book is awkward to handle and the photos are quite ugly reminding me of a baby book for the 30s. The colors chosen are on the dull side. I bought the book for the Darla blanket and I also like the snowflake one. There were several "onesies" which seem very old fashioned. Would a baby feel comfortable in one of those outfits? There are a few toys also. All the circular blankets use chunky yarn so they must be intended for rugs. Charts are included where needed and the instructions look quite thorough. I bought the book as a bargain book. I didn't look at the book before buying but I suggest to look before you purchase.

I have only tried one of the patterns in this book so far and it turned out ok, but I have a some experience. I had some problems with the yarn specifics and gauge. A few more diagrams might have helped a little too. Overall, I am glad I got it.

I did get to preview many of the patterns in this book prior to buying it. From that preview alone, I found several patterns I wanted to make - both knitted and crocheted. In fact, yarn has already been purchased! I particularly like the dresses and the bolero. The patterns use a variety of yarns - from baby to chunky weight; acrylic blends to 100% wool. Beginner knitters and crocheters could probably find something in this book to make. Well worth the money.

I will definitely be getting this book out again when the weather turns cold. With 2 little ones myself, baby things are my favorite to create. I was very pleased with the abundance of patterns, both for knitting and crochet. This works wonderful for me, because I do both. Finding modern crochet patterns can be very tricky. It seems that there are endless beautiful knit patterns, while everything crochet looks dated. I thought this book did a wonderful job of adding modern crochet patterns. There are an abundance of blanket patterns. All very sweet. I am not a fan of making blankets though (so much time!). However if blankets are something you enjoy, this book won't disappoint. One item I thought was missing was a modern baby bootie. I found it odd that a baby/toddler book wouldn't have a single pattern for booties. The styling of this book was spot on. The photos were just gorgeous. The chubby babies, natural lighting, floral textiles. It really took this book to a new level. I found myself wanting to make many of these patterns, especially the Paddington Coat and Cleire Cardigan. Each pattern includes an abundance of sizes. Mostly 3,6,9,12,18 and 24 months. I also thought that the section in the back was very helpful. It included all the specialized terms for knit/crochet. These can be tricky to memorize if you are just getting started. Nice to have them available in the book instead of having to Google them constantly. I will note that this is not a book for beginners, unless you are very ambitious. Most of the patterns are fairly complex. A more experienced knitter/crocheter would get the most use out of this one.*I received a free copy from NetGalley in exchange for my honest review.
